The Hastings School District encompasses over 170 square miles and is, geographically, one of the largest school districts in the Twin Cities metropolitan area. The high school system has a grade nine through twelve enrollment of approximately 1,455 students from a total district population of about 28,000 residents. Independent School District #200 serves the cities of Hampton, Hastings, Miesville, New Trier, and Vermillion, and portions of Denmark, Douglas, Hampton, Marshan, Nininger, Ravenna, and Vermillion townships. While most of the school district is located in Dakota County, parts of ISD #200 are in Washington and Goodhue Counties

ACCREDITATION

Hastings High School is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and by the Minnesota Department of Education.

Hastings High School offers a comprehensive curriculum which includes rigorous courses for college-bound students, relevant courses for students interested in vocational training, and realistic school-to-work programming. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT WITH DAKOTA COUNTY TECHNICAL COLLEGE:

Hastings High School has seventeen articulated courses with Dakota County Technical College. Under these agreements, you can enroll in a HHS course and receive college credit certifications upon successful completion of the course with a final grade of a B or better.

SEMESTER SYSTEM

Courses are offered on a semester system. Each semester is approximately eighteen weeks in duration. The school day consists of seven class periods. Each class period is approximately 45-50 minutes in length.

GRADING/RANKING SYSTEM

Hastings High School weights all classes equally using the grading marks and GPA values listed in the tables to the right. P (passing) and I (incomplete) marks do not impact a student's cumulative GPA. W- (withdrawal, failing), W+ (withdrawal, passing), R- (removal, failing), R+ (removal, passing), and NG (no grade) marks are equivalent to an F.

CLASS RANK AND RECOGNITION

Students are ranked at the end of each semester based on their cumulative GPA. Academic letters are awarded to students with a GPA of 3.75 or higher. HHS recognizes students as "Graduate with Highest Honors" for an earned GPA of 4.0, "Graduate with High Honors" for an earned GPA of 3.935 to 3.99, and "Graduate with Honors" for an earned GPA of 3.867 to 3.934.
