## Class Notes

You are expected to take notes each day using your extra example packet/note taking guide. They will not be graded, but they will be extremely useful to you. If you are absent, get the notes from watching the recorded lessons on Schoology. You will not use notes on your tests, but they can be used on test corrections.

## Homework

Homework will be graded daily. If it is turned in late, you will lose points! No late work will be accepted after the completion of a chapter. Please get into the habit of showing your work. Full credit cannot be earned if you don't show your work. Please see the rubric for more details. If you are absent for an assignment, get it from my Schoology page or from a classmate. You can go into CalcChat to see worked out problems from the assignments. WebAssign will also be used throughout the year to assign online assignments.

## Tests

If you miss a test, it must be made up within a week or you will receive a 0 . I will write your name on the backboard if you have a test to make up. We will have a test usually once or twice within a chapter.

No retakes on tests, but...you can come in before school, after school, or during a study hall to do test corrections. Test corrections involve using your notes and the hints that I have written down on your test to correct problems that you had wrong. You can earn up to $10 \%$ of the

(I also promise you that if you didn't pass the test originally and you make all of your corrections that you will end up with a passing grade on the test.) You may only correct your most recent test, so don't delay. It is a great way to fix your mistakes, and get a few more points for your grade.

## Quizzes/Small Group Work

Quizzes and small group work will be assigned throughout a chapter to check for your understanding of the current material. You will always be aware of when these quizzes or small group work will occur. The problems on these quizzes and small group work will be very much like the problems you complete on your homework assignments, as well as what you could expect to see on your upcoming test. Some of quizzes will be assigned through WebAssign.
